Daniel J. Keniry is the Senior Vice President of Government Relations for TIAA-CREF, a national financial services organization dedicated to those who work in the academic, medical and cultural fields. In this capacity, he is responsible for relations with Congress, the White House and federal government agencies and officials, and leading public policy activities in Washington.
